**Florida School Resource Officer Practitioner
Designation Application**

HISTORY

Since 1988, the Florida Crime Prevention Training Institute (FCPTI), through the Office of the Attorney General, has offered the designation of **SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER PRACTITIONER (SROP)**. This designation is conferred to document an individual's successful completion of FCPTI's SRO training program.

ELIGIBILITY

To qualify as a School Resource Officer Practitioner, the following requirements must be met:

1. The individual must have been employed as a certified law enforcement officer for a minimum of two years.
2. The officer must successfully complete the SRO Basic Training Course (40 hours) **offered by FCPTI**.
3. The officer must complete an additional 90 hours of law enforcement courses applicable to the role of a SRO **offered through or co-sponsored by FCPTI**. Only one FASRO Conference certificate of 24 hours can be applied towards this requirement.
4. The officer must complete the attached **SRO Practitioner Application**.
5. The officer should provide copies of certificates listed on the application.

MAINTAINING THE DESIGNATION

The initial Florida SRO Practitioner Designation is valid for a period of 2 years from the date that appears on the Florida SRO Practitioner certificate. To maintain the designation, it may be renewed by taking 8 hours of FCPTI juvenile-related training the year following the expiration. There will not be a specific renewal class, but the SRO will have the option of choosing a topic and class of 8 hours or more that he/she is interested in attending.
