**Florida SRO Specialist**

The “**SRO Specialist**” recognizes those SROs who have earned 88 hours of juvenile-related training from the Florida Crime Prevention Training Institute (FCPTI). There are two curriculum paths to this recognition:

I. Option = 88 hours

- 40 hour SRO Basic Training class
- 24 hour SRO Intermediate Training
- 24 hour SRO Advanced

**Or**

II. Option = 88 hours

- 24 hour FASRO Conference
- 64 hours Participants may select any combination of FCPTI juvenile-related training classes that will equal 64 hours.

These options allow an SRO the freedom to select his/her classes. In some instances, SROs are not able to take the SRO Basic Training class from FCPTI, so Option II takes that into consideration and does not require the Basic Class but does require attendance at one FASRO Conference.

The “**SRO Specialist**” recognition will expire within 2 years of completion and may be renewed by taking 8 hours of FCPTI juvenile-related training the year following the expiration. There will not be a specific renewal class, but the SRO will have the option of choosing a topic and class of 8 hours or more that he/she is interested in taking.

Those SROs who have taken the required training for the “**SRO Specialist**”, can go online at [www.fcpti.com](http://www.fcpti.com) and complete the application and submit it to the Attorney General’s Office. Upon verification, the certificate will be mailed to the applicant.

If an SRO chooses Option I to obtain the “**SRO Specialist**”, these hours may be applied to the Florida SRO Practitioner Designation. To obtain that designation, the SRO would need to take an additional 42 hours of juvenile-related training and apply for the designation.
